"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." Mark 12:30

There is a funny song in the musical Oklahoma called All er Nuthin. Will is a young cowboy in

love with a girl named Ado Annie, who is a little on the wild side. Will tells Ado Annie that she needs to settle down and be a one-man woman. Annie laments that for Will it's all or nothing, all for him and nothing for her. In Mark's gospel, a teacher of the law asked Jesus the question; "which is the greatest commandment?" Jesus responded: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself."

This text was the focus of a five-week Lenten Worship series of the Carnegie Area Ministerial Association which I had the pleasure and privilege of participating in. My assigned part of the text was "you shall love the Lord your God with all your strength". My guestion to the congregation on the day that I preached was, "How strong are you feeling today?" How strong are YOU feeling today? Can you move a mountain, lift a boulder, carry the weight of the world on your shoulders? Or, are you barely able to lift a feather? My guess is that it is somewhere in between these two extremes, probably toward the lower end of the scale. Jesus said, "love with all your strength."

What does it mean to love with all of our strength? It means that whatever our ability is on any given day, it is enough. It is enough because our strength comes from the Lord. The prophet Isaiah wrote: "I will trust and not be afraid, for the Lord God is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation."

PLUM is in a time of transition. We are forming a Call Committee to begin the process of looking for a new pastor or two. We are discerning who we are and what our mission is. All of our congregations are feeling the strain carrying membership concerns, finances, and ministry. Every one of us has our own personal weights to carry. Some days, there is just too much and we feel weak. Other days, we feel like we can carry the weight of the world and then some. Whichever day we are having, we have been blessed with the aift of community. Your weakest day is someone else's strong day. That is the beauty of PLUM.

As we move forward into a future that none of us can predict, we can do so with confidence because we know that God is in control and will carry us when needed. So love yourself, love your siblings in Christ, love God with all that you have. That is all that you can do.

So, yes Ado Annie, with God it is all er nuthin.

I close by asking all of you to include the following prayer in your prayers:

Most Gracious, generous, loving God;

You have called us all as minsters of our congregation and Pittsburgh Lutheran United Ministries. You have healed us through Jesus' incarnation, death and resurrection. You have called and entrusted us with the task of being disciples. Guide us in this important work for our congregation and for PLUM. Give us all courage to look back, to look ahead and to see where we are. Give us vision to see where you are working in and through us. Open our eyes to the needs of this community of believers and to the needs of the community that we are called to serve. Reveal your Spirit to us. Guide us as we seek to do your will in our daily lives.

We ask this in the name of Jesus who told us to ask in order to receive, to seek in order to find, and to knock for the door to be opened to us. Amen.


